
#### **Doug West, PE**

Doug West, PE, serves as Senior Resident Project Manager at Alfred Benesch & Company, with more than three decades of experience in interstate highway design and construction management. He specializes in managing project staff, coordinating subconsultant efforts and reviewing project documentation for numerous large-scale projects involving highway reconstruction, and bridge work. roadway Doug has successfully led projects for clients on the local and state levels, including the Chicago

Department of Transportation, Illinois Department of Transportation and Illinois State Toll Highway Authority.

Currently, he is leading construction management as the Project Manager for the 130th & Torrence Avenue project, a high-profile, \$101 million, and three-tiered grade separation and intersection reconfiguration on Chicago's south side. This contract entails a complex mix of roadway, railroad and structural improvements, most notably the installation of a new 394-foot, 4.75-million-pound steel railroad through truss bridge – believed to be the first of its kind ever rolled into place using Self-Propelled Modular Transporters (SPMTs).

#### ABSTRACT



Scope: During Phase I, various alternatives were examined to grade separate railroad traffic from vehicular traffic. In the end, an underpass alternative was selected as the preferred alternate that met the project needs. With a depressed roadway, alternative solutions for the railroad bridge types were developed and evaluated against the project needs. Benesch prepared TS&Ls for the preferred alternatives for the new railroad structures which included two three-track, two span, ballasted deck plate girder railroad bridges carrying the NS tracks over the depressed 130th Street and Torrence Avenue. **Background**: An industrial area just east of the Calumet River, located in the south side of Chicago, consists of three major streets: 130th Street; Torrence Avenue; and Brainard Avenue. There are two major railroad crossings: Norfolk Southern (NS) Railroad, at 130th and Torrence Avenue; and a commuter rail, CSS&SB/NICTD, that crosses over the NS at Torrence Avenue. The project proposed to eliminate traffic delays by grade separating the NS railroad at 130th Street and Torrence Avenue and to improve traffic flow by realigning 130th Street. There are three separate railroad grade separation structures in this project.

Torrence Avenue. A 394-foot long, double track, ballasted deck, through truss bridge was also constructed as a part of this project. This structure spans over existing NS tracks, as well as their future alignment, with minimal impact to the existing rail line. This bridge, the widened portion of Torrence Avenue, and the CSS&SB/NICTD plate girder approach spans was constructed on an offset alignment. During Phase II, Benesch developed alternatives for the assembly and erection of the truss span over the existing NS tracks. The preferred alternate required the truss assembly to occur on-site and then have it rolled it into place using self-propelled modular transporters. Benesch prepared Phase II documents for the project, which included final construction plans, detailed specifications and a cost estimate.
