The five individuals below become the first inductees of the IEHOF:

John Bardeen. Electrical engineer; former University of Illinois professor; cowinner of two Nobel prizes in physics-- for the invention of the transistor, and for an explanation of the phenomenon of superconductivity, which enabled applications such as the Josephson junction.

Walter E. Hanson. Civil and structural engineer; former University of Illinois associate professor, co-author of a seminal reference on foundation engineering, and founder of Hanson Professional Services, a national consulting engineering firm with principal offices in Springfield, IL.

Fazlur R. Khan. Civil and structural engineer; former partner of the architectural and engineering firm of Skidmore, Owings and Merrill; primarily responsible for the innovative designs of the Sears Tower and the John Hancock Building in Chicago, which fostered a resurgence of skyscraper-building.

Henry W. Magnuski. Electrical engineer; former research executive at Motorola Inc., holder of some 30 patents relating to communications systems, responsible for seminal work in microwave and mobile communications.

Ralph Modjeski. Civil engineer; innovator in bridge design and structures, founder of an engineering firm (originally headquartered in Chicago) implementing such designs, moving spirit in the Western Society of Engineers in Chicago for many years, and 1931 winner of the Washington Award.
