**Mr. Witold Kluza** graduated from University of Illinois at Chicago in 2003 with B.S and M.S in Civil Engineering with the emphasis on Structural Engineering. Between 2002-2003 worked for LORIG Construction and was involved in the construction of bridges throughout Chicagoland area. Mr. Kluza joined the US Army Corps of Engineers in 2003 and currently, he is a product/technical lead for three projects with the total construction cost estimated over \$50 millions.

Between 2008-2010 worked for Europe District as a Contracting Officer's Representative in the field office in Hohenfels, Germany and managed 15 construction projects. The projects varied from simple erosion control structures

to construction of the airfield to support unmanned aircrafts.

### Abstract for Presentation

U.S. Army base located in Hohenfels, Germany is one of the several European bases that provide military training for U.S. and allied troops. U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) offices are located in Europe to help U.S Army and others to accomplish the mission. The presentation will cover unique military projects built in the areas restricted to the public on the army base. The USACE mission and type of projects will be presented in a brief summary. The presentation will also indicate Polish presence in Hohenfels (known as LECHOW - work camp for WWII prisoners), by showing cemetery with the monuments of the Polish Army prisoners from the WWII.

On August 25th, 2012 during a meeting in the Polish Consulate in Chicago between Polish Government officials and Polonia, **Mr. Michael Niedzinski** was decorated with "Krzyż Kawalerski Orderu Zasługi Rzeczypospolitej Polski".

Mr. Niedzinski was born in Poland and arrived in USA as a teenager. After receiving BS and MS from University of Illinois and MBA from Illinois Institute of Technology, he worked in the materials and aerospace industry for over

30 years. He has patents in the metal processing industry and published in technical journals. In 1996 he received a "Sustained Effort" award from NASA for his work on the External tank of the Space Shuttle during the early years of the construction of International Space Station. Award was presented by astronaut Mark Lee, pioneer of multiple Space Shuttle flights. During the past 15 years he held senior management positions with companies like Reynolds, Alcan, Pechiney, McCook Metals and more recently Constellium. Since 1977 Mr. Niedzinski has been an active member of the Polish-American Engineers Association (PAEA) in Chicago; since 1981 has been the president of this organization. Thanks to his initiative, numerous Ralph Modjewski scholarships were awarded to student engineers of Polish descent. One of the key objectives of the PAEA organization is promoting achievements of Polish engineers in the Unites States. In October 2006, thanks to the efforts of PAEA, two great Polish engineers, Rudolf Modrzejewski and Henry Magnuski were inducted into the Illinois Engineering Hall of Fame. In November 2007, Kazimierz Patelski, former director of space flight control, was also inducted into this Hall of Fame. (Based on the article in Dziennik Zwiazkowy.)
